## CHAPTER MINUTES March 9, 2023 Beta Mu Meeting Minutes

Sharon Joca welcomed us and we had a wonderful snack from Lisa Allen's Committee. The foods went along with the evening's theme. Kim Mikowski. introduced our speaker. Francesca Weeks, Art Teacher, Coppergate School of the Arts. Terry Stanilonis led our Word Search Ice Breaker.

Schools For Africa is supported by Delta Kappa Gamma as a part of Impacting Education Worldwide.

Kim M. demonstrated how to find "Schools For Africa" on the DKG website. Thirty million children have

received education through this initiative. Lisa shared a few South African expressions with us as well.

Francesca is from South Africa and spoke about the challenges of teaching in South Africa. Most South

Africans are multilingual and speak two or more languages. Pupils must study at least 2 languages. She

pointed out that education is not free – parents are exempt from paying school fees in the poorest

Areas. We collected \$105 to donate to Francesca's school.

Peggy Elmore told us about Uganda and explained her display about missionary work in Africa. Her

friend Mary is a teacher at the Uganda Christian University.

Sharon Joca called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m. Jennie Eason shared our inspirational message.

She read from "All on the Board," a book about 2 men from London. She mentioned how we

encourage others.

The minutes were included in the March Newsletter. They will stand as published.

Pat Litterick gave the Treasurer's Report.

Ruth and Pat shared information about the Dolly Parton Imagination Library with \$40,697 total

donations so far. We have spent \$17,491 and have mailed 8239 book.s We need to continue fundraising. Pat has a chart to share about the books and expenses. Ruth invited everyone to join the

DPIL program. We are hopeful to have more people join to help with behind the scenes work. They

need help contacting daycares and donors. We need to sustain and grow the program with everyone's

help. Contact Pat or Ruth to volunteer. Thirty percent of our children who start kindergarten are

behind on the first day in the state of Florida

We discussed having a fundraiser at restaurants. We are hoping to do this with Bonos in Middleburg. Those

who participate need to bring in the paper to get credit. We would love help with these events.

Karen Robinson spoke about the T-shirts and please let her know if you would like to purchase one. We

wear them when we go to festivals and dinners.

Ruth spoke about membership and welcomed the new faces in our group. Biographies will be sent out

about each of the prospective members. Kathy Lawrence is planning to come to our next meeting.

Susan Horne is a Guidance Counselor at CHS. Mary Lou Whittlesey is a retired teacher. Mary Kenfield is with the Clay County Public Library. Kelly

Ludlam works in Reading Professional Development in Clay County.

We have donated 179 pounds through the DKG Food Drive so far. Lisa Forster read the thank you from

the Food Pantry. Please continue to bring food

items to all of our functions.

At our District 2 Meeting, we are in charge of one centerpiece. The theme is "Reaching for More in 2024."

Please begin thinking of a beach themed basket. It is March 2nd of 2024. We have a planning meeting in

April at the state convention. It will be in Palatka. Coming up in a month is the State Convention. Team Terry will be elected

State President. If we have a group of 9 or 10, we get to have lunch together at the same reserved

table. This chapter is the star of the state because of longevity, retention of members, number of

members, dedication, and commitment. There is a 6-year vision at the state level for the 100 th year
